Christmas Trees: The Tree of Promise

In recent years there has been an explosion of companies that help you trace your family tree. You can go back a dozen generations, uncovering the history of your ancestors. Tracing your family tree allows you to learn more about where you came from...who you are.

St. Matthew's Gospel begins by tracing Jesus' family tree. Providing the genealogy of Jesus proves that he is true man, exactly what we needed our Savior to be to take our place. It also demonstrates God's grace, for in Jesus' family tree you will find individuals whose heinous sins are recorded in Scripture: murder, prostitution, etc. The Christ is not the enemy of sinners. He is our brother. Finally, Jesus' family tree shows that God keeps all his promises. God had promised multiple believers – Eve, Abraham, David – that the Savior would be one of their descendants.

This week, we look at a very different type of Christmas tree – the Tree of Promise. Christmas shows that what God says will happen happens. God promised he would become one of us to save us all. In the fullness of time, he did just that!

From the Tree of Promise we learn that God keeps every single promise he makes to us.

First Reading

1 Samuel 16:1-13

The LORD said to Samuel, "How long will you mourn for Saul, since I have rejected him as king over Israel? Fill your horn with oil and go. I am sending you to Jesse of Bethlehem, for I see a king for myself among his sons."

² Samuel said, "How can I go? If Saul hears about it, he will kill me."

The LORD said, "Take a heifer with you and say, 'I have come to sacrifice to the LORD.' ³ Invite Jesse to the sacrifice, and I will let you know what you are to do. You are to anoint for me the person that I point out to you."

⁴ So Samuel did what the LORD had told him to do and went to Bethlehem. Trembling with fear, the elders of the city came to meet him. They said, "Do you come in peace?"

⁵ He said, "Yes, in peace. I have come to sacrifice to the LORD. Consecrate yourselves, and come with me to the sacrifice." He consecrated Jesse and his sons and invited them to the sacrifice.

 6 When they had come, he looked at Eliab and said, "Certainly this is the LORD's anointed."

⁷ But the LORD said to Samuel, "Do not look at his appearance or at how tall he is, because I have rejected him. For the LORD does not look at things the way man does. For man looks at the outward appearance, but the LORD looks at the heart."

 8 Then Jesse called Abinadab and had him pass in front of Samuel. But Samuel said, "The LORD has not chosen this one either."

 9 Then Jesse had Shammah pass by. But Samuel said, "The LORD has not chosen this one either."

 10 Jesse had seven of his sons pass before Samuel. Samuel said to Jesse, "The LORD has not chosen any of these." 11 Samuel said to Jesse, "Is that all of the young men?"

Jesse said, "There still is the youngest, but he is tending the sheep."

Samuel said to Jesse, "Send for him, for we cannot sit down to eat until he comes."

¹² He sent for him and brought him in. David had red hair and striking eyes, and was good-looking. The LORD said, "Get up! Anoint him, because this is the one."

¹³ So Samuel took the horn of oil and anointed him in the presence of his brothers. The Spirit of the LORD rushed on David with power from that day forward.

Gospel

Matthew 1:1,6,16-17

A record of the genealogy of Jesus Christ, the son of David, the son of Abraham.

⁶ Jesse was the father of King David. David was the father of Solomon, whose mother had been the wife of Uriah...¹⁶ Jacob was the father of Joseph, the husband of Mary, from whom Jesus was born (who is called Christ).

¹⁷ So altogether there were fourteen generations from Abraham to David, fourteen generations from David to the Babylonian exile, and fourteen generations from the Babylonian exile to Christ.

Matthew lists the full genealogy of Jesus in the first chapter of the book of Matthew. Verses 2-5 and 7-15 have been removed for today's reading but can be read in full in Matthew chapter 1.

Meditation

Isaiah 11:1-10

Oh Christmas tree, how lovely is your branch!

A shoot will spring up from the stump of Jesse, and a Branch from his roots will bear fruit.


² The Spirit of the LORD will rest on him: the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, the Spirit of counsel and might, the Spirit of knowledge and the fear of the LORD.

³ He will be delighted with the fear of the LORD. He will not judge by what he sees with his eyes, nor will he render decisions based on what he hears with his ears, ⁴ but with righteousness he will judge the poor, and he will render fair decisions in favor of the oppressed on the earth. He will strike the earth with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath from his lips he will put the wicked to death. ⁵ Righteousness will be the belt around his waist, and faithfulness the belt around his hips.

⁶ The wolf will dwell with the lamb, and the leopard will lie down with the young goat, the calf, the young lion, and the fattened calf together, and a little child will lead them. ⁷ The cow and the bear will graze together, and their young ones will lie down together. The lion will eat straw like the cattle. ⁸ The nursing child will play near a cobra's hole, and the weaned child will put his hand into a viper's den. ⁹ They will not hurt or destroy anywhere on my holy mountain, for the earth will be full of the knowledge of the Lord, as the waters cover the sea.

¹⁰ This is what will take place on that day. The peoples will seek the Root of Jesse, who will be standing like a banner for the peoples, and his resting place will be glorious.
